
## What is Graphic Design?






# What are Design Principles?

Graphic Design Principles are a set of guidelines and rules that designers use to create visually appealing, effective and organized Designs. These principles help ensure that the elements within a design work together harmoniously and communicate the intended message to the audience.

#### Graphic Design Principles:

Balance - Ensures that elements are distributed to create a sense of order Contrast - Highlights differences between elements creating visual interest Emphasis - Helps to make a specific element stand out as the main focus Proportion - Ensures that the sizes of elements relate well to each other Hierarchy - Organizes elements by importance, guiding the viewer's attention Alignment - Lines up elements to create a clean and cohesive look Repetition - Reuses similar elements throughout a design to create unity Movement - Directs the viewer's eye through the design in a specific path White Space - Uses empty space around elements to prevent clutter Harmony/Unity - Ensures all elements work together harmoniously



### **Examples**

Graphic Design is at the foundation of all Visual Art. This opens up a world of possibilities for Graphic Designers when choosing the kind of project they want to work on or get employed for. From projects related to digital products like UI/UX Design or moving images like Motion Graphics, or static content like Corporate & Brand Design or even real world applications like poster and flyer design - a Graphic Designer is the person who can do the job. You may need to learn additional skills for each of these tasks, but the knowledge and experience in Graphic Design is a must.

#### **UI UX DESIGN**




